





Until recently, steel used for scientific or medical uses had to be sourced from salvaged sunken World War I and II battleships, as any steel produced after 1945 and the birth of atomic and nuclear bombs was contaminated with radiation. Air or oxygen is used to make steel, and since 1945, the atmosphere has been polluted with nuclear isotopes from atomic bomb testing. This pre-1945 steel is called low-background steel. Water does a fine job of protecting the battleship steel



from atmospheric radiation pollution.

This radiation pollution peaked in 1963, when the US and the Soviet Union signed the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, ending atmospheric tests of nuclear weapons. Since the end of atmospheric nuclear testing, background radiation has decreased to very near natural levels, making special low-background steel no longer necessary for most but not all radiation-sensitive uses, as brand-new steel now has a low enough radioactive signature that it can generally be used.

Radiation contamination is also used to detect fake artworks. All new canvas and paints have the markers of nuclear bomb tests, and pre-1945 paintings don't.

LNG PIPELINE STREAM and RIVER CROSSINGS



"World class" construction methods on Coastal GasLink pipeline

When a pipeline is finished, it is pressure-tested with water. Each km of the 48"-diameter PRGT pipeline would require more than 1100 cubic metres of water. This water, taken from the Skeena watershed, could fill 70 Olympic-sized swimming pools – the daily water use of one-half a million Canadians. After testing, the water – contaminated with biocides, oils, and welding slag – would be discharged back into the watershed.

From the outlet of Babine Lake to the Cranberry River, the Prince Rupert Gas Transmission pipeline (PRGT) would cross 289 streams and rivers. Most of these crossings would use the "open cut" method, where the pipe is trenched directly across the riverbed. In some of the crossings, the watercourse would be dammed and pumped dry before the pipe was laid across. Drilling into the bedrock is planned to tunnel the pipeline under the Nilkitkwa, Shegunia, Skeena, Kispiox, and Cranberry.

The future of Skeena and Nass salmon is on the line. Construction of the Coastal GasLink Pipeline showed that neither industry or its regulators cared to prevent permanent damage to streams and rivers and the fish that live in them. We should expect no different if the PRGT was constructed in the Skeena watershed.

LIVING WITH LNG PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION

Construction of the PRGT pipeline would almost double the population of the Hazeltons for 3 1/2 years. Work camps housing 3,000 are planned for the Suskwa Valley, Salmon River Road, and two camps in the Kispiox Valley. Experience elsewhere has shown that the transient workforce of pipeline construction brings trouble to local communities, while draining resources and hammering infrastructure.

The City of Terrace described its experience with Coastal GasLink Pipeline:

"The City of Terrace sees its role as a hub [of pipeline construction] as a detriment to Terrace and especially the quality of life for its residents. Being the hub has allowed for massive inflation in professional and retail services, a strain on municipal infrastructure like roads, refuse disposal, lodgings and housing. Some might see this influx as a key economic driver but it has actually been the opposite. The influx of workers required for this type of development has seen housing in Terrace reach an all time high in prices and a vacancy rate of less than 1%. We have seen double digit increase in our homeless population; now 1 in 8 are homeless. This spike is due to landlord evictions for higher rents and a sale market that is out of reach. With the homelessness and influx of remote workers to Terrace. crime has increased and with it significant increases to policing, and emergency response costs."



Pipeline construction would affect daily life in the Hazeltons:
