SOS SAVE OUR SUSKWA TOWN MEETING

*****ATTENTION ALL HAZELTONIANS *****

RESIDENTS, BUSINESSES AND ROAD USERS OF THE SUSKWA VALLEY NEED YOUR SUPPORT

The current Bulkley River Bridge crossing has been the only access to the Suskwa since 1967. It now needs to be replaced. The Ministry of Forests (Prince George and Victoria Offices) proposes to close the existing access to the Suskwa and install a NEW bridge and NEW forest service road (FSR)16 km on the east side of the Bulkley River along 16 km of gravel forest service road where it will join Highway 16 near Porphryr Creek.

This option was chosen without any formal open public engagement or meaningful consultation with residents, local businesses, municipal governments, Regional District Kitimat-Stikine, local First Nations bands, any affected hereditary chiefs or the general Hazelton public. No one has expressed any support for this option!

In 2021, as a solution residents and the territorial Chief for the lower Suskwa proposed that a new bridge across the Bulkley River be installed just before Mudflat Creek that bypasses the steep hillside and narrow roadway adjacent to the Bulkley River with an upgraded/enhanced junction at Highway 16. Forestry failed to seriously consider this as an option.

NO ONE on the Suskwa is in favour of the proposed Porphryr Creek route! Currently, the Suskwa encompasses 51 people with property interests, 19 families with 11 children who have built their livelihoods there, 41 deeded properties, and 17 Suskwa businesses, several of which will unfortunately be forced to relocate or close. This Project will also not just affect residents and other road users but also will detrimentally affect the economic welfare of all communities and businesses of the Hazeltons.

Very few Hazeltonians know about this project. It has been the best kept secret in the Hazeltons since 2016. Why you ask? We can but surmise that Forestry's decision-makers have known since 2014 about PRGT's intent to construct a pipeline in our area. The existing access is slated in PRGT's 2014 Environment Assessment certificate as one of three MAIN transport routes for delivering PRGT equipment and supplies to the pipeline corridor. Forestry has not mentioned the pipeline nor its' impact on this Project in any of their reports. It bears asking... "Has PRGT been informed or is Forestry trying to ram this project through as a taxpayer paid project with NO additional public notifications and consultations by PRGT?".

We hope you will come out and support us at this meeting.
