





The Perils of Climbing Mount Everest

Last week the boot and sock (and foot) of Brit Andrew Comyn "Sandy" Irvine was found on Mount Everest's Rongbuk Glacier. Irvine disappeared on a quest to summit the world's highest mountain one hundred years ago. George Mallory disappeared on the same 1924 expedition. He was found in 1999 by an expedition specifically looking for Irvine and Mallory.



Since 1953 when New Zealand's Edmund Hillary and Nepalese Sherpa Tenzing Norway were the first to crest the mountain, there have been approximately 11,346 successful summit ascents of Mount Everest by 6098 people. Nepalese Sherpas have summited Mount Everest the most by far, with Kami Rita holding the record with 30 summits from 1994 to 2024. Eight Canadians have accomplished the feat, Elia Saikaly five times.



Three hundred and forty people have perished trying to summit or returning from summiting, including eight this year. The vast majority of attempts are made in April and May, and it takes about a week to climb to the peak from Base Camp, as climbers have to ascend to and descend from four additional camps over several days to acclimatize their bodies to the tremendous altitude.

New affordable apartments renting soon in Hazelton

Ama sii anjok "Good New Homes"



HAZELTON - Seniors, families, individuals and people living with disabilities in the Upper Skeena area will soon have access to affordable housing as construction is nearing completion on 31 rental homes.

Located at 2720 Highway 62, across from the Hazelton High School and the new Upper Skeena Recreation Centre, the three-storey building will include one, two and three bedroom units, six of which are fully accessible. Other amenities include a modest multipurpose room, indoor bike storage and a laundry room. The grounds are landscaped with a well equipped playground to the south. All units will be equipped with standard kitchen appliances, with the larger units also including washers and driers.

To ensure affordability the building has 6 units with "deep subsidy" support, 15 units with "Rent Geared to Income" support and the remaining 10 homes with rents set at affordable market rates.

The Wrinch Memorial Foundation Society will manage the new building which is currently scheduled to be ready for occupancy in March. More details will follow in the next month or two, concerning the BC Housing application process, income testing, and the anticipated rent schedule.
