The End of the Paper Grand

Most Canadians know that the \$1 bill was replaced by the loonie (1989) and the \$2 bill was replaced by the toonie (1996), but not everyone knows that this year is the **25th anniversary** of the \$1000 bill being withdrawn from circulation. On May 12, 2000, the Bank of Canada yanked the \$1000 bill to fight money laundering and organized crime.



The last series of the \$1000 bill was pink and printed with Queen Elizabeth II on the face and pine grosbeak birds on the back. Thirteen years later the humble penny (94% steel, 1.5% nickel, 4.5% copper) was withdrawn from circulation simply because its value was significantly below the cost of production.
